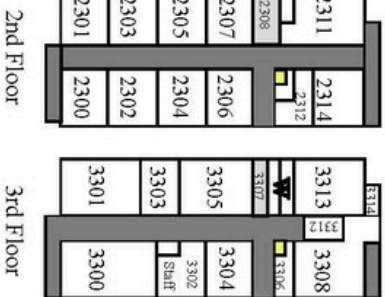

Change Requests

*Any timetable requests made over the summer will be completed by the first day of school. Please check PowerSchool regularly to see changes. Please **do not submit the form again** or send an email requesting changes as this only slows the process.*

- Grade 9 & 10 should have a full time table with A & B classes in Period 1,3,5,7 in Semester 1 & 2.
- Grade 11 & 12 please ensure that you have the correct courses and number of credits needed to graduate. Please see a counsellor or administrator if you are not sure.

**Actual teachers and room assignments for Gateway classes will be supplied by Gateway.*

- Make timetable changes if needed. ***This must be done before going to the bookstore to get textbooks.***
- Get your picture taken for the yearbook and ID card. ***You must have your ID card in order to get your Bus Pass.***
- Go to the bookstore to pay fees, pick up textbooks and get your bus pass.

Our school timetable has undergone some changes over the last two years to provide students with more support and further opportunities for growth and success. The changes resulted from the advice of a committee that looked at different schedules around the province and consulted with various groups within our school community.

REACH Time for Students

One of the goals of our timetable is to provide students and teachers with the opportunity to have time in their day to accomplish their goals. REACH time reflects our school values of **Respect, Empathy, Achievement, Courage & Honour**. In our timetable, students always have some REACH time in their day and have extended REACH time on Friday afternoons.

- On Monday to Thursday, there are two 15 minute REACH blocks each day, one in the morning between periods 1 & 3 and one in the afternoon between periods 5 & 7. We know that students do not always need extended periods of time to access their teachers outside of class time; these smaller time periods in both the morning and the afternoon will give students convenient and easy opportunities to ask quick questions or seek clarifications.
- Our lunch hour is 60 minutes long and teachers have REACH time scheduled at lunch for 3 - 30 minute sessions per week. These lunch sessions will allow students additional time to get help or review for tests. Students also have an extended lunch for days when they need a break.
- Our modified schedule on REACH Fridays will run 10 times in semester 1 and 10 times in semester 2. The afternoon will now include two 55 minute REACH blocks The REACH afternoon will give students the opportunity to complete missing assignments, attend review sessions for upcoming exams or attend staff-led sessions that will afford them an opportunity for enrichment and extra practice in performance courses, such as Fine Arts, CTS and/or Physical Education. Students will also have opportunities to partake in subject area activities that are not in their current timetables. Students may be assigned to REACH blocks if they are failing courses or have missing assignments.

We hope our timetable will continue to provide our students with opportunities for growth and success!

2025-2026 BUS PASS INFORMATION

- If you are eligible for a bus pass, a numbered micro chip will be placed on your Student ID card and this will serve as your bus pass for the entire school year. There will be a replacement fee if the ID/Bus Pass needs to be replaced.
- What makes a student eligible to receive a bus pass sticker from LTCHS?
 - must live in Red Deer
 - lives 2 km or more from LTCHS, which is your designated school
 - if you live farther than 2 km from your designated school and 2 km from LTCHS

**** We are only able to provide a bus pass for our eligible students****



APPLY FOR A BUS PASS

The online 25/26 Transit form will be found in the Student Fees/Online Forms tab of your **Parent PowerSchool** account in **mid August**, this form is for City Transit buses only, NOT the yellow charter buses.

**** Lost or stolen cards must be reported to the bookstore immediately so that the card can be deactivated. A replacement ID card / Bus Pass will be issued for a fee of \$15.00. ****

IMPORTANT NEWS FROM RED DEER TRANSIT REGARDING SCHOOL START UP

Red Deer Transit will allow a grace period of two days to students so they have time to purchase their September 2025 bus passes. During this time students will be able to access free transportation to and from school between the hours of 6:15 am to 5:15 pm on **September 2 & 3**. Regular bus fares will apply at all other times and dates.

ARRIVING BY CAR?



A drop off area is provided on the side of 42a Ave for students to be dropped off. **Please do not use the bus lane or staff parking lots as fines may be issued to owners whose cars are in this area.** The south parking lot, first parking lot when driving north on 42a Ave., is available for parents who wish to visit the school.

If you have an older brother or sister who drives they need to know that **parking passes are required for all students parking at the school**. Passes are sold at the bookstore to valid driver's license holders only, at a **cost of \$10 for the year**.

Passes will hang from the rear view mirror and are therefore transferable, so a student may register all family vehicles at the time of purchase. Replacements for lost passes will cost the full amount. A limited number of daily parking passes are available at the office for \$1 to valid driver's license holders only.

Students are asked to park in designated areas only. Students may **NOT** park in visitor or staff parking. Violators will be issued tickets and their vehicles may be towed away. Driving violations will be reported directly to the RCMP. A Commissionaire is on duty and has the authority to ticket vehicles. LTCHS does not accept responsibility for damages and/or thefts which occur in the parking lot. Complaints should be filed with the RCMP.

The Student Assistance Centre (SAC) is located on the second floor of the school. Immunizations

As part of Alberta's universal immunization program, Alberta Health and Wellness offers and recommends:

All grade 9 students receive Diphtheria/Tetanus/Pertussis (dTap) immunization and Meningococcal (Groups A,C, W-135, Y) conjugate vaccine. All Grade 9 **Girls** receive Human Papillomavirus vaccine given as a series of three immunizations during the school year.

Information pamphlets and consent forms for the vaccines for which your child is eligible will be sent home in the fall. Please watch for these consents and return to the school as per instructions on the forms. School Expectations

CARE OF PREMISES

Individuals and classes are encouraged to help keep work and common areas tidy and safe. Your input is needed and appreciated. Any damage, accidental or intentional, should be reported to the office. Persons responsible for non-intentional damage who immediately voluntarily report the circumstances to the office will be held responsible for the cost of replacement parts, but not labour costs. Students who are guilty of vandalism through graffiti will be charged (\$2400.00) under the Red Deer City bylaw. In addition LTCHS is a member of a student Crime-stoppers network. Persons wishing to report illegal activities within the school may call anonymously to 1-800- 222-TIPS (8477).

COMPUTER USE

Students are expected to use information and communication technology (computers) as an educational resource and in a responsible fashion. Students are subject to disciplinary action in the event of inappropriate or unacceptable use.

WE ARE A SCENT FREE SCHOOL

Please avoid the use of perfumes, colognes & AXE spray while at LTCHS. These scents can be very harmful to many students and staff in our building.

NO TOBACCO USE

Tobacco use is not accepted in the school, on the grounds, in the parking lot or the areas adjacent to the school, nor is it accepted on the sidewalk by the parking lot. It is important for students to understand that there is 'no boundary line' beyond which smoking will be okay. As Lindsay Thurber's property is adjacent to other schools and to residential areas, it is not okay for students to congregate in any area just outside of Thurber boundaries to have a smoke or use tobacco products.

The decision about whether or not to smoke is one that each person must make for himself or herself. Smoking causes cancer and is a very serious health risk. While all persons are encouraged not to use tobacco, the school is not making the life decision for the student – that decision is the responsibility of the student. We do expect, however, that students abide by school rules – no use or possession of tobacco products at school.

NO DRUG OR ALCOHOL USE

As educators, we can only advise as to the difficulties alcohol or drugs can create. However, we are able to insist that all persons associated with the school avoid the use of, or association with anyone using, drugs or alcohol during the time school is in session or during school sponsored activities. In addition, while in school, possession of any item associated with drugs is prohibited. Such items will be confiscated and turned over to the RCMP.



Anyone who challenges these rules, or who is associated with those who challenge these rules will be referred to a counsellor, face suspension and/or recommendation for expulsion. Persons involved with drugs or alcohol during curricular or extra-curricular field trips will face a 1 year suspension from all extra-curricular activities.

NO WEAPONS AT SCHOOL

A weapon is anything that is commonly used or designed to hurt someone or to put someone in fear. This definition also includes fake (facsimile) weapons. Students shall not be in possession on school premises at any time or while in any school-sponsored curricular or extracurricular activity, of a weapon as defined above. Possession of a weapon at school or at a school sponsored event or the sending of images of a weapon that could potentially cause fear for other students will result in a suspension with a potential for further disciplinary action.

APPROPRIATE CLOTHING REQUIRED

Student apparel should contribute to a positive school atmosphere that facilitates learning and demonstrates respect. Therefore all the latest fashions are not necessarily suitable for school.

- For health and safety, appropriate footwear must be worn at school
- Clothing must be free of offensive, discriminatory, suggestive, illegal activities, violent, gory, inappropriate language or graphics
- Underwear or clothing that acts as underwear must be covered at all times
- Hats are permitted within the school building but students may be asked to remove them in certain settings as directed by their teacher
- Hoods are not permitted to be worn up within the school building and students will be asked to remove them
- Suitable clothing is required for various classes such as physical education, practical arts, and various trades that are offered. Students should check with their instructor as to the clothing requirements.

In the event that a student is wearing something that a staff member believes is not appropriate for school environment, the staff member will address the issue with the student discretely and respectfully, and ask them to change their clothing or cover up.

Students are expected to respectfully comply with the decision of the staff member in these instances. Exceptions will be made for religious considerations or where health and safety are concerned.

LTCHS Academic Honesty Policy

Academic honesty is an approach to studies in which students conduct themselves with personal integrity and comply with established academic practices in terms of the authenticity of their work and assessments without misrepresenting others work as their own.

Academic dishonesty intended or inadvertent includes, but is not limited to:

- Plagiarism misrepresenting another person's or persons' work or ideas to be your own. This can include word-for-word copying or paraphrasing without proper acknowledgement.
- Collusion work done by more than one person that is intended to be completed by a single person. Collusion is distinct from collaboration in that collaboration is cooperation on academic work which is expressly permitted and openly acknowledged. Collaboration, for example, can be permitted within the context of a science lab that is completed with a partner. Likewise, group presentations are by their nature collaborative. Collusion also includes supporting malpractice by another student, as in allowing one's work to be copied or submitted for assessment by another.
- Duplication of work, the presentation of the same work for different assessment components and/or diploma requirements.
- Misconduct not complying with regulations such as exam regulations. This can include, but is not limited to, bringing prohibited items such as mobile phones into examinations or using unauthorized calculators on examinations.

Students are responsible to ensure all work submitted is their own authentic work and gives proper acknowledgement to those on whose ideas the work is based. If a student is found to be guilty of academic dishonesty an administrator, in consultation with the student, teacher, and parent/guardian, will determine an appropriate consequence. Such consequences can include, but are not limited to:

- An opportunity to complete an alternative assessment.
- Receiving no mark for the assessment.
- A letter of discipline be placed in the student file.
- Repeated incidences of academic dishonesty can result in an in-school or out-of-school suspension

Digital Citizenship

The staff at LTCHS recognize that there are many uses for digital technology within the classroom environment. These uses include, but are not limited to, web browsing, blogging, wikis, all of which can be accessed by traditional desktop/laptop computers, iPads, Chromebooks and/or many other portable electronic devices. We recognize that these technologies may provide many exciting learning opportunities for staff and students but also recognize that issues may arise from their misuse. To ensure students benefit from digital technologies and practice good digital citizenship, we ask that all students abide by the following guidelines which focus on safe, responsible and ethical use of digital technologies:

- Students/Digital Citizens are expected to keep LTCHS a safe and caring environment; this encompasses all digital realms. As such, this includes keeping personal information private, maintaining civility in digital communications, fostering positive relationships and protecting themselves and their classmates from harm such as bullying and intimidation.
- Students/Digital Citizens are expected to understand that any information posted online is permanent and their digital footprint is everlasting. Posts, online comments, uploads, etc. should be done in a manner that demonstrates responsible use of digital communications and will not have any negative impact on themselves or others. Students also need to understand that the use of digital technologies at school are for academic purposes as outlined by the course and teacher.
- Students/Digital Citizens are expected to be honest, honorable and decent when using digital communications and or resources. Students will use and verify the credibility of sources, credit the work of others, respect different points of view and demonstrate behaviour that is academically ethical.

Lindsay Thurber is a safe and dynamic learning environment and the use of digital technologies and communications is a fundamental extension of that learning environment. In accordance, any issues that arise from the use of digital technologies will be investigated by school administration as with any other matter in point regarding safety, responsibility or ethical misuse.

COMMUNICATION IS KEY

ATTENDANCE

Students at Lindsay Thurber are required to have a 90% or better attendance rate in order to participate in extracurricular activities. This includes (but is not limited to) participation in extracurricular events (including Athletics and Fine Arts), field trips, and all graduation events (including the formal ceremony as well as the grand march & prom).



We understand that there are often factors that prevent children from attending school and parents/guardians are best suited to make this decision. Therefore this attendance responsibility and expectation policy applies only to unverified absences. Parents have one week from the date of the absence to verify it by contacting our attendance line at **403-314-2017** or lt-attendance@rdpsd.ab.ca. Any absences not verified after a week has passed, will remain unverified in our system.

****Please do not call or email more than once for a verification as that slows down the process****

ILL AT SCHOOL

If your child becomes ill while at school your child will need to advise a teacher or the office. A phone call will then be made to you, their parent/guardian, to obtain permission for the student to leave the school. Students will need to sign out at the office prior to leaving for the day. If possible, students should try to obtain homework from the classes they will be missing before leaving.

DAILY HEALTH SCREENING

We want to remind families of the importance of being diligent with our health protocols so our focus can be on teaching and learning. Please keep your child home if they are sick.

CHANGE OF INFORMATION (RSVP)
